Angela: Hello, good afternoon. Today we are in our lovely school, our lovely building. We're on our second episode of our science project podcast, and today we have this lovely gentleman wearing a white T-shirt. He's so aesthetic.

He's one of my best friends, by the way.

As you remember, on the first episode we talked about AI and we introduced AI in education. We made a little bit of an introduction to what AI is, and today we are going to talk about AI in school and how it's used in education. So, what can we say about AI in education?

Caleb: All is used in schools to improve the learning experience for students and to support teachers in their work. Some ways All is used include personalized learning and Al-powered systems, as well as apps that help teachers in the classroom. For example, Canva has All tools that assist in making presentations, stickers, and other helpful content for class.

Angela: That's right. We said in the first episode that one of the biggest benefits of AI is personalization, and today we're talking about that. You can personalize a lot of things for school, and many teachers use AI for schoolwork, even for making exams. Maybe not at our school, but we've heard of teachers in other schools using AI to create tests, forms, and questions.

Caleb: Another use is AI tutoring systems. These systems can provide one-on-one support for students, helping them improve in specific subjects and get better grades. AI can act like a tutor and guide students step by step.

Angela: That's completely true. Many students use AI to get better grades or to work more efficiently on their homework. And many teachers use it as well. Some might not like it too much, probably because they don't see it as necessary or they feel it weakens the learning process. But we believe AI is very useful, and it's not a bad thing if used correctly.

Caleb: All can help teachers create exams that are then applied to students to assess their understanding and give them grades.

Angela: Exactly. Most teachers use these tools for grading or to better understand how much their students know. We think that's one of the most important uses of AI in education.

Caleb: Al can also help students study. Just like old flashcards people used to write on, Al tools can now act like virtual flashcards. You can use it for practice, memorization, or simply checking information you forgot.

Angela: That's very helpful, especially for students who need a quick reminder or extra support. All can be like your study buddy.

Caleb: Do you have another idea of how AI helps in school?

Angela: Honestly, it's obvious that both teachers and students use AI. But in many schools, AI tools aren't fully allowed yet. Some schools have rules that restrict it, or some teachers believe it's not necessary. Some support AI completely and think it's the best tool ever, while others don't find it good enough. That's what makes this topic so interesting.

Caleb: Now let's talk about AI in school and its red flags.

Angela: Tell me, what's a red flag you see in AI?

Caleb:

One red flag is dependency. Some students rely too much on AI to do all their homework and schoolwork. They get used to asking AI for answers instead of trying to do it themselves.

Angela: Yes, many students and even teachers depend too much on what Al provides. One of the biggest red flags is when students let Al do all the work. They'll say "Let's ask ChatGPT" instead of thinking on their own. That's a problem.

Caleb: Another red flag is using AI to cheat on exams. Some students use it to get higher grades, but those grades aren't real or earned.

Angela: Exactly. You might see an A+ on your exam, but deep down you know it's not your work. That's a serious red flag because you're not really learning anything. You're letting a tool do everything, and that's not the right way to use it.

Caleb: I think everyone has used AI at some point—teachers, students, adults—but it's not a bad thing if you use it the right way. If you use AI responsibly, it's a very powerful and helpful tool.

Angela: That's true. Al isn't a bad thing at all. It's actually very useful, and we can use it a lot in school in positive ways. People sometimes fear it or think it's harmful, but it's just a tool. Like everything else, it depends on how we use it.

Caleb: Al in school is good if you know how to use it. If you don't, it won't really help you.

Angela: Exactly. All might be new to some people, and not everyone is aware of what it truly is. As students and adults, we should take a moment to research and understand what Al is and how we can use it in incredible ways. If you need to use Al, use it responsibly. We should all use Al, the internet, and social media with responsibility and care.

Angela: So, to wrap this up what are our final thoughts about AI in school? We love AI, maybe sometimes we hate it, but overall, we love it!
